Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing it to close its agency at Farmersville Station on its San Joaquin Division in Tulare County.

Applicant alleges that Eleven (11) Dollars of passenger business was transacted by the agency at the station of Farmersville during the annual period ending October 31, 1927; that Two Eundred Twenty (220) Dollars of less than carload business was transacted by said agency during said annual period; that carload freight business in emount of \$2,169.00 was transacted by said agency during the same period; that interested shippers and receivers of carload freight have been interviewed by applicant and have expressed their approval to the proposed abandonment provided a representative of applicant be placed at this point during the heavy fruit shipping season, which representative, applicant has agreed to provide. The California Farm Bureau through its manager offers no objection to granting of application subject to the above provision.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to close its agency at the station of Farmersville, located on the Visalia Brench of its San Joaquin Division in Tulare County, same to be maintained in the future as a non-agency station and to amend its tariff accordingly.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
