FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Application having been filed by Ford L. Howland re-
questing the Commission to amend and modify its Decision
No. 18125, dated March 30, 1927, by reducing and restricting
the area in which said Ford L. Howland obligates himself to
serve water as a public utility under the terms of that certain
franchise granted to him by the County of Los Angeles known as
Ordinance No. 1449 (New Series) and it appearing that this is
not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the
request should be granted, and other good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this Commission's Decision
No. 18125, dated March 30, 1927, be and the same is hereby
amended and modified as follows:

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity
require and will require that Ford L. Howland construct
and operate a public utility water system to supply

water for domestic and other purposes to consumers residing only in that portion of the territory set out more particularly in that certain franchise granted to said Ford L. Howland by the County of Los Angeles and known as Ordinance No. 1449 (New Series) as follows:

"Parcels 37, 38, 39, 40, and that portion of Parcel 49 commencing at a point in the west line thereof 86 feet from the north line thereof and running easterly parallel to the north line of said parcel a distance of 500 feet, thence southerly parallel to the east line of said parcel to the south line of said parcel, thence westerly on said south line to the west line of said parcel, thence northerly to the point of beginning, and that portion of Parcel 50 commencing at a point in the west line thereof 162 feet south of the north line thereof, thence easterly parallel with the south line thereof a distance of 500 feet, thence northerly parallel with the east line thereof to the north line thereof, thence westerly on said line to the west line thereof, thence southerly on said west line to the point of beginning, and all of that parcel designated as Tract Number 7690; all of said parcels thus far described being east of Baldwin Avenue.

ALSO Parcel 47 and the easterly 797 feet of Parcel 24 and the easterly 1110 feet of the parcel situate on the southwest corner of Olive Street and Baldwin Avenue, all of said parcels and portions thereof just described being contiguous to Baldwin Avenue.

ALSO the westerly 293 feet of the parcel situate on the northwest corner of Olive Street and Baldwin Avenue."

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects this Commission's said Decision No. 18125 shall remain in full force and effect.
