IT IS HEREBY OFDERED that the Commission's order on Page 8 of said Decision No.20188 be and it is hereby amanded to read as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and the same is hereby granted to A. Harwood for the operation of an automobile gruck line as a common carrier of freight between Willits and Garberville and the intermediate points of Outlet, Arnold, Longvale, Laytonville, Twin Rocks, Cummings, Leggett Valley, Rockport, Redwood Flat, Andersonia, Richardson Grove and Piercy, also between Laytonville and Branscomb; and for automobile stage service as a common carrier of passengers and express between Laytonville and Branscomb, subject to the following conditions: In all other respects the order of the Commission is to remain unchanged.
