## ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 22nd day of October asking for authority to abandon and remove its freight and passenger station building at the non-agency station of Coram, in Shasta County, California.

Applicant alleges that said station building was boarded up a few years ago and has not been used for a number of years; that the smelter located near Coram was closed prior to 1919 and since that year has been entirely removed; that shipments of sulphide ore from Coram to Wabuska were discontinued in June of this year, and applicant has been informed that such shipments will not be resumed, and that the maintenance of a station building at said Coram station is not now necessary nor likely to become necessary in the future.

California Farm Eureau Federation has signified by letter that it will not object to the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that the present proceeding is not one in which a public hearing is necessary; that the

station building at said Corem station is not necessary for the conduct of applicant's business, and that this application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove its freight and passenger station building at the non-agency station of Coram, on its Shasta Division, in the County of Shasta, State of California, provided, however, that coincident with the removal of said station building no other facilities will be removed.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
