ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its agency station at Bray on the main line of its Shasta Division in Siskiyou County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that the factory of the Crater Lake Box Company was completely destroyed by fire on July 17,1928; that it has been informed by the Crater Lake Box Company that it does not contemplate rebuilding said factory and this company, which has heretofore been the principal shipper at this point, has no objection to the closing of this agency.

Applicant further alleges that since the destruction of this plant by fire said agency has become unremunerative, and as there is an agency station at Leaf, 1.3 miles east, it is the opinion of applicant that the continued maintenance of the agency station at Bray is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

The California Farm Bureau Federation has signified, by letter, that it will offer no objection to the granting of this

application to close the agency at Bray.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandom its agency at the station of Bray, located on the main line of its Shasta Division in Siskiyou County, State of California, provided this station is continued in the company's records as a non-agency station and the tariffs are amended in accordance with the rules of this Commission.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
