OFINION and ORDER

Mc Connell Mirons has applied to the Railroad Commission for an order approving the sale and transfer by him to Ben Level Mirons of an operating right for an automotive trucking service between Fresno and Stratford, and Ben Level Mirons has asked for authority to purchase and acquire said operating right and to hereafter operate thereunder, the sale and transfer to be in accordance with an agreement, a copy of which, marked Exhibit "A", is attached to the application herein and made a part thereof.

The consideration to be paid for the property herein proposed to be transferred as given as \$\infty\$1000. Of this sum \$\infty\$700 is declared to be the value of equipment and \$\infty\$500 is said to be the value of intangibles.

The operating right herein proposed to be transforred was granted to Mc Connell Hirons by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No.17551, dated October 29, 1926, and issued on application No.12584. The right authorizes operation:

"****** of an automobile truck service for the transportation of freight as a common carrier between Fresno and Stratford, and from the intermediate point of Lemoore to Stratford (but excluding service from or to all other intermediate points) over and along the following route, viz: from Fresno via Elm Avenue to Hub, thence by County Highway to Lemoore, and thence by County Highway to Stratford."

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Ben Level Hirons is hereby placed upon notice that "operative rights" do not constitute a class of property which should be capitalized or used as an element of value in determining reasonable rates. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the state which is not in any respect limited to the number of rights which may be given.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

- 1- The consideration to be paid for the property herein authorized to be transferred shall never be urged before this Commission or any other rate fixing body as a measure of value of said property for rate fixing, or any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.
- 2- Applicant Mc Connell Hirons shall immediately unite with applicant Ben Level Mirons in common supplement to the tariffs on file with the Commission, applicant Mc Connell Mirons on the one hand withdrawing, and applicant Ben Level Mirons on the other hand accepting and establishing such tariffs and all effective supplements thereto.
- 3- Applicant Mc Connoll Mirons shall immediately withdraw time schedules filed in his name with the Railroad
 Commission and applicant Ben Level Mirons shall immediately
 file, in duplicate, in his own name time schedules
 covering service heretofore given by applicant
 Mc Connell Mirons, which time schedules shall be identical
 with the time schedules now on file with the Railroad
 Commission in the name of applicant Mc Connell Mirons
 or time schedules satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.

The rights and privileges herein authorized may not be sold, leased, transferred nor assigned, nor service thereunder discontinued, unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such sale, lease, transfer, assignment or discontinuance has first been secured.

5- No vehicle may be operated by applicant
Ben Level Hirons unless such vehicle is owned by said
applicant or is leased by him under a contract or
agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad
Commission.
