ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On September 20, 1927, this Commission issued an Order to B. G. Adams directing him to appear and show cause why he should not be punished for contempt for disobedience of our Decision No. 17,796 in the above entitled matter.

Since the rendition of the above Order, and by the terms of Decision No. 20,462 in Application 15,031, this Commission has authorized the transfer of the water system operated by said B. G. Adams, and known as the "Vermont Water Company" to the Los Angeles and Suburban Water Company. The refunds ordered by said Decision 17,796 have likewise, in so far as possible, been completed. In view of these circumstances we do not feel that we should proceed further with this matter, and it will, therefore, be dismissed.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the contempt

proceeding: directed against said B. G. Adams be and the same is hereby dismissed.
