Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of three industrial spur tracks located upon its right of way at Olig Station on its Asphalto Branch, San Joaquin Division in Kern County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map, San Joaquin Division Drawing A-3509, attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that the track herein proposed to be abandoned is owned by applicant; that the track was constructed prior to 1916; that sometime ago said tracks were used to serve the Pacific Oil Company and its successor in interest, the Associated Oil Company; that the Associated Oil Company is no longer using said tracks and has advised applicant it will have no further use for same and that tracks are not now needed for any purpose, nor in the opinion of applicant, likely to be needed in the future.

The past users of these tracks, Associated Oil Company and Standard Oil Company of California have signified by letter that they have no objection to the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove the three spur tracks located upon its right of way at Olig Station on its Asphalto Branch, San Joaquin Division in Kern County and as more definitely shown in yellow on map, San Joaquin Division Drawing . A 3509, attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
