SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Applicant, Sierra Pacific Power Company, having filed its supplemental application asking the Commission to make its order issuing a certificate in accordance with the findings in Decision No. 20700, and it appearing that on February 11, 1929, the Board of Supervisors of Sierra County awarded applicant a fifty year franchise (Ordinance No. 125) to construct, maintain and operate electric facilities in Sierra County, a certified copy of this ordinance being attached to the application,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and the same is hereby granted to Sierra Pacific Power Company for the construction or extension of its line or system within that portion of Sierra County lying generally east of Sierra City, and, in so far as it is necessary in connection therewith, for the exercise of rights and

privileges granted by said Ordinance No. 125 of the County of Sierra.

The authority herein granted shall become effective when applicant files with this Commission a stipulation to the effect that it will never claim for the franchise a value in excess of the amount actually paid to the County of Sierra.
