ORDER OF DISMISSAL

In this proceeding the City of Burlingame asks the Commission to make its order fixing certain rates for electrolier street lighting service furnished by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, and a rental charge for use of certain underground street lighting facilities owned by Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

A public hearing was held June 28th, 1928, before Commissioner Carr, at which time testimony was introduced and the matter submitted.

Decision in this matter has been withheld pending negotiations between the parties involved and complainant now asks that the matter be dismissed without prejudice.
