O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 28th day of February, 1929, asking for authority to abandon and remove an industrial spur track serving the Inyo Development Company located near Keeler, on its Mina Branch line in Inyo County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Salt Lake Divn. Drawing A-2198, Sheet 1) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that the track herein proposed to be abandoned is owned by applicant and is constructed entirely on its own right-of-way; that the track was constructed about the year 1907 to serve the Inyo Development Company, and connected with a certain industrial track owned by that company that has since been removed. Applicant further alleges that the use of same was discontinued about three years ago, and is not now needed, nor likely to be needed for any purpose in the future.

The Great Western Electro-Chemical Company, owner of the Inyo Development Company, has signified by letter that it has no objections to the removal of this track.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove its spur track serving the Inyo Development Company and located near Keeler, on its Mina Branch line in Inyo County, and as more definitely shown in yellow on map "Salt Lake Divn. Drawing A-2198, Sheet 1," attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
