OPINION AND ORDER

ORIGINAL

This is an application filed under the provisions of Section 51(a) of the Public Utilities Act by the Golden West Warehouse Company, a copartnership consisting of H. T. Dunning and Ethel Dunning, husband and wife, E. S. Hazeltine and wife, and the Smeltzer Lima Bean Growers Association, a non-profit cooperative association, for an order authorizing the latter company to purchase the public utility warehouse and equipment located at Smeltzer and now operated by the Golden West Warehouse Company.

The properties to be sold and transferred consist of a frame building containing 12,000 square feet of floor space located in Smeltzer. The proposed purchase price is \$12,000.00.

The records show that the warehouse has been operated by the Golden West Warehouse Company since March 9, 1920, under the provisions of Warehouse Tariff No. 1, C.R.C. No. 1, and Warehouse Tariff No. 2, C.R.C. No. 2, effective July 20, 1922, lawfully on file with the Commission. In the future the warehouse will be operated for the mutual benefit of the members of the Smeltzer Lima Bean Growers Association.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter not requiring a formal hearing and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be and the same is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. The consideration to be paid for the sale of the property herein authorized shall never be urged before this Commission or any other rate fixing body as a measure of value of said property for rate fixing, or any purpose other than the sale herein authorized.
2. Applicant, Golden West Warehouse Company, shall immediately file with the Commission supplement to the tariff cancelling the rates, rules and regulations shown in Tariff No. 2, C.R.C. No. 2.
