OPINION

In Application No. 15246 Del Norte Peoples Telephone
Company asks permission to file a schedule of rates and charges
similar to the rates and charges set forth in Exhibit "A" attached
to the petition.

In Application No. 15247 Chetco Southern Telephone Company asks permission to file a schedule of rates and charges similar to the schedule of rates and charges set forth in Exhibit "A" attached to the petition in such application.

In Application No. 15248 Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company and Chetco Southern Telephone Company ask permission to sell and transfer their properties situated in the State of California to West Coast Telephone Company of California. The West Coast Telephone Company of California asks permission to acquire such properties and to issue 7,425 shares (par value \$25.00 per share) of stock for the purposes hereinafter stated.

The purpose of these proceedings is two-fold. First, to consolidate in one ownership (West Coast Telephone Company of California) telephone properties in Del Norte, Humboldt and Siskiyou Counties and finance such properties through the issue of stock by the West Coast Telephone Company of California; and second, to secure permission to file and charge a schedule of rates for telephone and telegraph service rendered in the territory now served by the Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company and by the Chetco Southern Telephone Company.

Chetco Southern Telephone Company was organized under the laws of the State of Oregon on or about October 15, 1909. It built a telephone line from Harbor, Oregon, to Crescent City, California. This line was completed about 1911. It appears that at approximately the same time, Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company, a corporation organized on or about March 22, 1910, under the laws of the State of California, was operating a telephone exchange at Crescent City and built a toll telephone line from Crescent City to Trinidad, California. The Chetco Southern Telephone Company established a telephone exchange at Smith River, California, which was on the route of its toll line.

During 1916 the Chetco Southern Telephone Company sold its line within Crescent City to the Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company, but continued the operation of the line from the city limits of Crescent City to Harbor, Oregon, including the Smith River exchange. During 1917 the Coos and Curry Telephone Company, operating in Coos and Curry Counties, Oregon, began negotiations with a view of acquiring control of the properties of the Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company. After acquiring control of the companies the Coos and Curry Telephone Company operated the properties from its headquarters at Marshfield, Oregon. In 1928 the properties of Coos and Curry Telephone Company were acquired by West Coast Telephone Company, with headquarters at Everett, Washington. In view of Section twenty-six of the Public Utilities Act of California, those in control of West Coast Telephone Company have caused to be organized, West Coast Telephone Company of California. By Decision No. 20683, dated January 17, 1929, the Railroad Commission authorized Klamath Telephone and Telegraph Company and Butte Valley Telephone Company to sell their properties situate in California to West Coast Telephone Company of California. It is now proposed to transfer to the West Coast Telephone Company of California the properties of Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company and the properties of Chetco Southern Telephone Company, situate in California.

There is attached to the petition in Application No. 15248 an exhibit prepared by W. W. Hardinger, consulting engineer, in which he estimates the reproduction cost new of the properties of Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company as of December 31, 1927, at \$169,917.00 and the reproduction cost less depreciation at \$160,612.00. Applicants did not call Mr. Hardinger as a witness to testify in support of his estimated reproduction cost new of the properties. Counsel for applicants, as well as Earl Murphy, district commercial supervisor of West Coast Telephone Com-

pany and in charge of the commercial operations of West Coast Telephone Company of California, stated during the course of the hearing that they had examined the valuation (Exhibit No. 1) of the properties of Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company, prepared by F. M. Casal, one of the Commission's assistant engineers, and that they would accept such valuation for the purpose of these proceedings. In Exhibit No. 1 Mr. Casal submits that \$90,996.00 represents a reasonable rate base for the properties of Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company and Chetco Southern Telephone Company for the period July 1, 1928 to June 30, 1929. This figure represents his estimate of the historical cost new of the properties and includes \$3,500.00 for materials and supplies and working cash capital.

The West Coast Telephone Company of California submitted evidence at the hearing showing that it intends to improve the service at Crescent City. Since the hearing it has filed a statement showing that \$30,920.00 will be expended by it for the following purposes;-

The company reports that while its study of plant improvements has not yet been completed, the above figures represent approximately the cost of its proposed improvements. This cost was not included in the rate base suggested by F. M. Casal.

The West Coast Telephone Company of California has an authorized stock issue of \$250,000.00 divided into 10,000 shares of the par value of \$25.00 each. We have considered the record in this proceeding and believe that applicant West Coast Telephone Company of California should be permitted to issue and sell for not less than par \$113,900.00 par value of its common capital stock for the following purposes;-

a.	To pay for properties of Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company and Chetco Southern Telephone Company	\$78,400.00

If the selling corporations are willing to accept stock of West Coast Telephone Company of California in payment for their properties, it may deliver not exceeding \$78,400.00 of stock in payment for such properties in lieu of paying for the properties in cash. The stock, however, must be accepted by the vendors on a par basis.

The order herein will authorize the issue of \$113,900.00 of stock and will also authorize Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company to sell and transfer all of their properties to the West Coast Telephone Company of California.

As to the filing of rates, it occurs to us that inasmuch as the order herein will authorize the Chetco Southern Telephone Company and the Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company to sell and transfer their properties to the West Coast Telephone Company of California, that nothing will be gained by requiring the two former companies to file schedule of rates and then have the latter company adopt such schedule of rates. It seems to us that the rates which the West Coast Telephone Company of California may collect should

in the first instance be filed by that company. There is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" the rates which we believe the West Coast Telephone Company of California should put into effect throughout the territory, in California, now served by Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company. The rates set forth in Exhibit "A" are substantially the same as those now charged by the two companies. They cover exchange and toll telephone service, telegraph service and charges for service rendered incidental to said telephone and telegraph service.

Exhibit one filed in these proceedings contains maps showing the exchange areas and primary rate areas of Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company. The West Coast Telephone Company of California should file maps of exchange areas and primary rate areas covering the same territory as is shown by the maps appearing in Exhibit one. The company should also file with the Commission in satisfactory form rules and regulations covering its telephone, telegraph and other service.

While Paul A. Brunt, a subscriber, entered an appearance as protesting the granting of the applications insofar as they involve the fixing of rates, he called no witnesses in support of any protest. Representatives of West Coast Telephone Company of California admitted that some of the service conditions to which Mr. Brunt called attention were not satisfactory and that steps would be taken to improve such conditions. In view of the proposal by the company to improve its service, it occurs to us that there is no necessity for further comment on this situation.

ORDER

A public hearing having been held in the above entitled applications before Examiner Fankhauser, and the Commission having considered the evidence submitted at such hearing, and being of the

opinion that the West Coast Telephone Company of California should be permitted to issue \$113,900.00 par value of its common capital stock and that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for by the issue of such stock is reasonably required by applicant, and that the expenditures herein authorized are not in whole or in part reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income, and the Commission being further of the opinion that the above entitled applications should be granted to the extent and in the manner indicated in this order, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Chetco Southern Telephone Company and the Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company be, and they are hereby, authorized to sell and transfer all of their properties situated in California to the West Coast Telephone Company of California, such sale and transfer to be effected on or before July 1, 1929.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the West Coast Telephone Company of California be, and it is hereby, authorized to issue on or before July 1, 1929, \$78,400.00 par value of its common capital stock in payment for the properties of Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company. Said West Coast Telephone Company of California may deliver said \$78,400.00 of stock or sell said stock at not less than par and deliver the cash proceeds in payment for the aforesaid properties.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the West Coast Telephone Company of California be, and it is hereby, authorized to issue and sell, at not less than par, on or before December 15, 1929, \$35,500.00 par value of its common capital stock and use \$1,000.00 of the proceeds to pay for the properties of the Klamath Telephone and Telegraph Company and Butte Valley Telephone Company, referred to in Decision No. 20683, dated January 17, 1929; to use \$3,500.00 of the proceeds for the purchase of materials and supplies and cash working capital and to expend \$31,000.00 of the proceeds for the purposes set forth in the opinion which precedes this order.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the authority herein granted to transfer properties and to issue stock will become effective fifteen (15) days after the date hereof, and that West Coast Telephone Company of California shall keep such record of the issue and sale of the stock herein authorized and of the use of the proceeds as will enable it to file reports under the Commission's General Order No. 24, which order, insofar as applicable, is made a part of this order.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that within 30 days after the acquisition of the properties of the Chetco ^{Southern} Telephone Company and the Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company, the West Coast Telephone Company of California shall file with the Railroad Commission a certified copy of the deed or other instruments of conveyance under which it acquires title to the aforesaid properties.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY FINDS as a fact that the rates now charged by Chetco Southern Telephone Company and Del Norte Peoples Telephone Company for telephone and telegraph service, and services incidental thereto are unjust and unreasonable insofar as they differ from the rates set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which rates the Commission finds should be filed by the West Coast Telephone Company of California.

Basing its order on the foregoing finding of fact and such other findings of facts as are set forth in the opinion which precedes this order;

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that West Coast Telephone Company of California be, and it is hereby, authorized to charge and collect on and after June 1, 1929, the schedule of rates set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part of this order.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that the West Coast Telephone Company of California shall, on or before May 27, 1929, in accordance with the manner and form prescribed by General Order No. 68 file-

- (a) Schedule of rates as shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- (b) Maps showing its exchange and primary rate areas, as indicated in Exhibit one filed in these proceedings.
- (c) Rules and regulations, in form satisfactory to the Railroad Commission, governing the furnishing of telephone and telegraph service and service incidental to such telephone and telegraph service.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Application No. 15248 insofar as it involves the issue of \$71,725.00 of stock, and Applications No. 15246 and No. 15247 be, and the same are hereby, dismissed without prejudice.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty(20) days from and after the date hereof.

(2) Hotel private branch exchange service will be provided outside the primary rate area and within the exchange area at the above rates plus mileage.

(3) Stations provided at the above rates are installed on the premises on which the switchboard is located. The above rates plus mileage rates are applicable to outside stations. In cases where both wall sets and desk sets are installed in guest rooms, station rates will be applied to the total number of stations at the desk set rate less 25% for each wall set station.

EXCHANGE SERVICE - SCHEDULE NO. A-13.

PUBLIC TELEPHONE PAY STATION SERVICE.

SERVICE:

Applicable to service from the Company's
non-listed public pay stations throughout the
territory served.

EXCHANGE SERVICE - SCHEDULE NO. A - 14.

JOINT USER SERVICE.

SERVICE:

Applicable to Joint User Service furnished in all exchanges.

RATE:

Each Joint User Service in connection with Individual Line Business Flat Rate Service-

One half of the individual line business wall set rate applicable in the Primary Rate Area of the Exchange in which Joint User Service is requested.

CONDITIONS:

(1) Joint user service will be furnished in connection with individual line business service only.

(2) The applicability of joint user service is determined by the obvious or actual use made of the service.

(3) The rate for joint user service includes a listing in the telephone directory, and applies in addition to the rates and charges for the facilities and all other service provided. Joint user service is applicable and is furnished upon application made by the subscriber as follows:

(a) Application for the use of the subscriber's service by any individual, firm, company or association occupying jointly or in part the premises on which the subscriber's facilities are located. The subscriber's facilities or service are not to be extended off the premises to provide joint user service.

(b) Application for the use of the subscriber's service for another business conducted separately by the subscriber and differing in character from that for which the facilities are provided.

(4) In the case of individuals, firms, companies and associations engaged in the same business or profession, utilizing a common reception room with offices opening thereon or adjoining thereto, one of the number may become the subscriber and the remainder joint users. If the individuals or members of a firm, company or association file a joint income tax return that will be accepted as sufficient evidence of a single business, and joint user service is not applicable. Whenever any individual, member of a firm, company or association does not substantially participate in the earnings of his fellow members of such firm, company or association, then that fact shall be conclusive evidence that he is a joint user and the joint user rate is applicable.

(EXCHANGE SERVICE SCHED. NO. A-14 Continued).

(5) The minimum charge for joint user service shall be the monthly rate, provided that if the listing is included in the telephone directory, the service shall be paid for until the end of the directory period, unless the joint user vacates the subscriber's premises or the subscriber's service is discontinued, or the joint user becomes a subscriber to business service in the same exchange.

(6) All charges in connection with joint user service will be billed to the subscriber with whom the joint user is associated.

A designation descriptive of the business or profession will be included if the name does not indicate the nature of the business.

(2) Business listings may be those of individuals engaged in a business or profession, names of firms or members thereof, the names of corporations or the officers thereof, and the names of employees. A trade name made up by adding a term, such as company, agency, shop, works, etc., to the name of a commodity will not be accepted as a listing unless the subscriber is authorized to do business under that name. Listings are not accepted which appear to be designed primarily to give publicity to a commodity or service.

(3) All additional listings in connection with a subscriber's service must bear the same address and telephone number as the primary listing, except that additional listings in connection with private branch exchange stations and extension stations not located on the same premises as the primary station may show the address at which the station is located but will be accepted only in the name of the subscriber.

(4) Residence listings consist of a name, an abbreviation indicating "residence," the address of the premises at which service is furnished, and the telephone number.

(5) Residence listings may be those of the subscriber or members of the subscriber's domestic establishment residing on the premises in which the subscriber's service is provided.

(6) The charges for additional listings begin with the day they are entered in the information records, and when such listings are included in the directory, they may not be discontinued until the end of the directory period, unless the listed party vacates the subscriber's premises, or subscribes for service of the

same class as furnished the subscriber, or unless the subscriber's service is discontinued. Or in the case of a guest listing the listed party becomes a subscriber to residence service in his own name in the same exchange.

(7) All applications for additional listings and lines of information shall be made by the subscriber.

(8) Telephone numbers of public telephones will not be listed in the telephone directory.
