SECOND SUPPLEMENT TO INTERLOCUTORY ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, defendant herein, through its subsidiary, Southern Pacific Motor Transport Company, requests authority to re-route its bus line, as hereinafter set forth, from that specified in this Commission's Decision No. 20429, dated November 7th, 1928, and Decision No. 20616, dated December 21st, 1928, in the above entitled proceeding, involving the operation of defendant's bus route in Oakland, which affords a connection between the Seventh Street electric line and Broadway. It is alleged that on account of heavy vehicular traffic and street cars along Eighth Street, the bus is delayed to such an extent that it is late in making connection with the electric trains at Seventh and Oak Streets. The City Council of the City of Oakland have by Resolution No. 44273 N.S. approved the re-routing of this

service.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary, and that the request should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to re-route its bus line in the City of Oakland to the following route:

Commencing at the intersection of Seventh Street and Oak Street, thence west along Seventh Street to Franklin Street, thence north along Franklin Street to 19th Street, thence west along 19th Street to Broadway, thence north along Broadway to 20th Street, thence east along 20th Street to Franklin Street, thence south along Franklin Street to 9th Street, thence east along 9th Street to Oak Street, and thence south along Oak Street to the point of beginning.

The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders, relative to the route of said motor bus route, as to it may seem right and proper in its judgment, if the public convenience and necessity demand such action.

In all other respects this Commission's orders heretofore entered in the above mentioned proceeding shall remain in full force and effect.
