ORDER

Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the discontinuance of passenger trains Nos. 160, 161, 162 and 163, between Little River Junction and Eureka, Humboldt County.

Applicant alleges that trains Nos. 160 and 161 operate only on Saturdays and that trains Nos. 162 and 163 operate only on Sundays; that these trains have been operated for the convenience of employees of the lumber companies in the vicinity of Little River Junction; that the patronage on said trains is not sufficient to meet the out-of-pocket expense or justify their operation; and that it proposes to operate trains on week-ends, as extra trains, as the business may warrant affording adequate service to the employees of said lumber companies and all persons now served.

Hammond Lumber Company, Little River Redwood Company and Dolber & Carson Lumber Company, operators in the vicinity of Little River Junction, have signified by letter that they have no objection to the discontinuance of said trains.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company to discontinue the operation of trains Nos. 160, 161, 162 and 163, between Little River Junction and Eureka, Humboldt County, California, upon posting five (5) days' notice at all stations between Eureka and Little River Junction.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof:
