ORIGINAL

Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of its non-agency station building at Tocaloma on its Point Reyes Line in Marin County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Drawing No. C.E. E-89) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that said station building obstructs the view of the users of highway at Crossing No. 5-C-31.3, adjacent to the station; that said station building is not now being used, nor likely to be used or needed in the future; that requests have been received from the residents of Tocaloma asking that said station building be removed; that the abandonment of said non-agency station building will not involve the abandonment of any other facilities; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station building is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public. The California Farm Bureau Federation has signified by letter that it will not oppose the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in

which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station building at Tocaloma, located on the Point Reyes Line in Marin County.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
