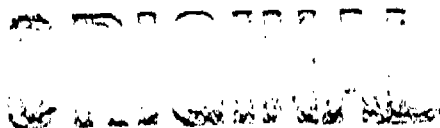

BY THE COMMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, The Western Pacific Railroad Company did on June 4, 1926, apply to the Railroad Commission for permission to issue and sell \$3,000,000.00 of its first mortgage five percent bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Commission by its Decision No. 17046, dated July 2, 1926, authorized the company to issue and sell \$2,600,000.00 of such bonds to reimburse its treasury and to finance the cost of extensions, additions and betterments, but held in abeyance the request to issue the remaining \$400,000.00 of such bonds, because no evidence was submitted showing that the issue of said \$400,000.00 of bonds was necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Commission now has been advised by applicant that it has no objection to the dismissal of this application insofar as the issue of the aforesaid \$400,000.00 of bonds is concerned; and

Good Cause Appearing; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the above entitled application insofar as it involves the issue of the aforesaid \$400,000.00 of bonds be, and it hereby is, dismissed without prejudice.
