ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its non-agency station of Sparrow, on its Coast Division in Santa Clara County, and the removal of a side track at said station and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Coast Division Drawing No. 23151) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business was transacted at said non-agency station during the annual period ending March 31, 1929; that no freight business was transacted at said station during the four years ending December 31, 1928; that said track was constructed for the handling of shipments of sugar beets; that sugar beets are no longer grown in this vicinity, and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station of Sparrow, in Santa Clara County; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; to cancel in conformity with the rules of this Commission all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said non-agency station, and to abandon and remove the side track at said station shown in yellow on the map attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
