## ORDER,

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of an industrial track located at Los Gatos, in Santa Clara County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Coast Division Drawing 15543) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that the track herein proposed to be abandoned is owned by South Pacific Coast Railway Company, lessor to applicant, and is constructed in part on private property adjoining its right-of-way; that the track was constructed about 1880 as a part of a main line but a subsequent line change diverted main line use and track shown in yellow was retained and used as an industrial track; that all industries located on said track ceased operations prior to 1913; that track has not been used since that date and that, in the opinion of applicant, it is not and will not be needed for any purpose.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove that portion of a spur track located at Los Gatos, in Santa Clara County, shown in yellow on the map attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
