

Decision No. 21384.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing the abandonment of a non-agency station at Mail Dock, County of Solano, State of California, and the abandonment and removal of a spur track at said Mail Dock Station.

ORDER**ORIGINAL**

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 15th day of July, 1929, asking for authority to abandon its non-agency station at Mail Dock, Solano County, and shown on blue-print map M-222 attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that no passenger or freight business of any description was transacted at this station during the annual period ending April 30, 1929; that the station and facilities are not now required for any purpose, nor, in applicant's opinion, likely to be required in the future, and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station at Mail Dock in Solano County; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records, and to cancel in conformity with the rules of this Commission all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said non-agency station and to remove all station facilities, including spur track 779 feet in length as shown on the blueprint map (M-222) attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
