BY THE COMMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

San Diego & Arizona Railway Company, applicant herein, having on September 13th, 1929, requested permission to discontinue the operation of mixed train service on its Lakeside Branch, alleging that during the period from January 1st, 1929, to July 31st, 1929, but fourteen (14) passengers have used this service, affording a revenue of \$6.70. Applicant proposes to continue the freight service on this branch on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of each week, these being the days on which mixed train service is now operating, and will arrange to have express by truck daily, except Sunday, between all stations on said Lakeside Branch. It is the opinion of the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the request is reasonable and should be granted; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 19379, dated February 17, 1928, and Decision No. 19842, dated May 29, 1928, in this proceeding, be and they are hereby modified, with respect to requiring applicant to operate mixed train service on

its Lakeside Branch, and permission is hereby given to discontinue the passenger service on this line providing that applicant shall, for at least ten (10) days before the discontinuance of said mixed train service, post notices in all trains and in all stations on said Lakeside Branch notifying the public of such discontinuance. Freight service on the line is to be continued as set forth above.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
