BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

WHEREAS, Lancaster Chamber of Commerce filed complaint against Antelope Valley Telephone Company in which this Commission was requested to make its order requiring defendant to establish continuous twenty-four hour telephone service in Lancaster and vicinity, and,

WHEREAS, Antelope Valley Telephone Company answered the complaint and filed application for an adjustment of rates sufficient to permit it to furnish the extended hours of service, and,

WHEREAS, the two matters were heard before Examiner Satterwhite in Lancaster on June 12, 1928, the hearing was adjourned

and the Commission issued its Interim Order No. 19980, dated July 3, 1928, requiring applicant to render continuous twenty-four hour service and providing temporary rates therefor,

NOW comes J. J. Deuel, representing Lancaster Chamber of Commerce, and in writing signifies agreement to the temporary schedule being made permanent and applicant also having agreed to the temporary schedule being made permanent, therefore,

Basing its finding upon the evidence of record in these proceedings;

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby finds that the rates formerly charged by Antelope Valley Telephone Company are unjust and unreasonable for the service now being furnished and that the aforementioned temporary schedule of rates should be made effective and permanent.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the rates and tariffs set forth in this Commission's Interim Order No. 19980, dated July 3, 1928, be and the same hereby are approved and continued as the established rates and tariffs of Antelope Valley Telephone Company.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the above entitled and numbered complaint be and the same hereby is dismissed without prejudice.
