## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, applicant herein, on August 9th, 1929, filed with the Commission its Supplemental Application, asking for a modification of the Commission's Decision No. 21020, dated April 26th, 1929, in the above entitled matter, with respect to the establishment of a wig-wag for the protection of the grade crossing authorized in said decision. This supplemental application requested that in the event the Commission still considered that the crossing should be protected by a wig-was, the expense be borne by the applicant instead of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Failway Company, as the order provides.

The Commission, after carefully considering this supplemental application, has reached the conclusion that its first order is proper, that the crossing should be protected by

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a wig-wag and that, in view of the fact that the new crossing replaces an existing one, it is reasonable that the railroad should pay for the cost of installing and maintaining this protection, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the requests for a modification of this Commission's order, as set forth in the supplomental application, be and it is hereby denied.
