OPINION and ORDER on  
SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION

This is a supplemental application by California Parlor Car Tours Company, a corporation, for an order of the Railroad Commission modifying the certificate of public convenience and necessity under which it is operating an automotive service between San Francisco and Los Angeles, via the Coast route, with no service to points intermediate between the terminals. The service is what is described as an all-expense two-day tour.

Under the terms of the certificate authorizing the service granted by the Railroad Commission in Decision No. 17904, the Company is required to operate even though no passengers appear. Applicant, in this supplemental application, asks that its certificate be amended so as to permit it to eliminate any scheduled trip if six passengers do not present themselves for transportation. It is claimed that an out of pocket loss results from a trip made for less than 6 passengers. The further claim is made that during certain periods of the year tourist travel is so light that there is practically no demand for the service, either from Los Angeles or San Francisco.

Under the circumstances we are of the opinion that this supplemental application should be granted. We are of the further opinion that it is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity for a two-day automotive tour between San Francisco and Los Angeles granted to California Parlor Car Tours Company by Railroad Commission Decision No.17904 be amended by the addition of the following condition to the provisions of the order in said decision:

That unless six or more passengers present themselves for transportation on any scheduled trip, such trip may be canceled.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that California Parlor Car Tours Company shall immediately file supplements to its tariffs and time schedules covering the change in operation herein authorized.
