

Decision No. 21825.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the abandonment (a) of non-agency station of Hillcrest, in the County of Solano, State of California, and (b) of a passenger shelter shed at said station.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of passenger shelter shed and abandonment of its non-agency station of Hillcrest on its Western Division in Solano County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Hillcrest) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that a passenger business was transacted at the non-agency station of three (3) dollars during the annual period ending September 30th, 1929; that no less than carload business was transacted at said station during said annual period; that no carload freight business was transacted at said station during the same period; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the applica-

tion should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon and remove passenger shelter shed and abandon its non-agency station of Hillcrest, located on the Napa Branch of its Western Division in Solano County and to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records, and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said non-agency station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
