WHEREAS, George J. Nixon, to whom this Commission by  
Decision No. 9918, dated December 23, 1921, and issued on  
Application No. 7315, granted a certificate of public convenience  
and necessity to operate an automotive service for the transpor-  
tation of passengers and property between San Diego and Imperial  
Beach and certain intermediate points, has advised the Commission,  
in writing, under date of November 28, 1929, that on November 17,  
1929, he discontinued operation of said service, now

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public conven-  
ience and necessity granted to George J. Nixon by said Decision  
No. 9918 be and the same is hereby revoked and annulled, and

schedules heretofore filed with the Railroad Commission by said  
George J. Nixon covering said service be and the same are hereby  
canceled.
