FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Marvel A. Harris and James H. Devine, co-partners, whom this Commission by its Decision No. 17515, dated October 21, 1926, granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a trucking service as a common carrier of farm products between Blake's Station and Sacramento, have advised the Commission, in writing, under date of November 22, 1929, that they are no longer operating this service, having discontinued it "some time ago", now

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Marvel A. Harris and James H. Devine, co-partners, by Decision No. 17515 be and the same is hereby revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that tariffs and time schedules filed with the Railroad Commission by Harris and Devine covering said service be and the same are hereby canceled.
