OPINION and ORDER on on SUPPLEMENTAL APPLICATION

In this supplemental application applicants, who were authorized by Decision No.10723, dated July 15, 1922, to transport passengers and freight by automobile (seasonally) between San Bernardino and Glenn Ranch, ask for authority to discontinue the business of transporting freight.

Applicants T. L. Tally and Seymour Tally operate Glean
Ranch as a resort. They haul their own freight and in connection
therewith have, under authority of the Commission, hauled also
for the general public. They now assert that for more than a
year no public freight has been offered. It is not their intention
to discontinue the transportation of passengers.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicants herein be and they are hereby authorized to discontinue the business of transporting freight by automobile between San Bernardino and Clenn Ranch, and that part of the operating right authorizing transportation of freight is hereby revoked.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that applicants shall immediately cancel rates and time schedules covering said freight service on file with the Railroad Commission.
