SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, the Railroad Commission by Decision No. 19870, dated June 8, 1928, as amended, authorized Great Western Power Company of California to issue and sell, on or before December 31,1929, at not less than 97 percent of their face value plus accrued interest, \$10,000,000.00 of three year 4-1/2 percent gold notes; and

conditions, it has been unable to dispose of its notes and asks that it be given additional time within which to do so, and also that the Commission modify its former orders so as to permit it to make the necessary changes in the dates of the indenture and the supplemental indenture under the terms of which the notes would be issued; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is of the opinion that this request should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the time within which the Great Western Power Company of California may issue and sell the \$10,000,000 of 4-1/2 percent gold notes, the issue of which is authorized by Decision No. 19870, dated June 8, 1928, as amended, be, and 1t hereby is, extended to and including December 31, 1930.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 19870, dated June 8, 1928, as amended, be, and it hereby is, modified so as to permit Great Western Power Company of California, in the event it issues the \$10,000,000.00 of notes, to make the necessary changes in the dates in the indenture and supplemental indenture heretofore authorized to be executed, by the order in said decision No. 19870, as amended.

IT IS HEREEY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 19870, dated June 8, 1928, as amended, shall remain in full
force and effect, except as modified by this Second Supplemental
Order.
