OPINION and

This is an application by W. J. Harris for an order of the Railroad Commission authorizing him to discontinue the business of transporting fruits and vegetables by motor truck between Oakland and San Jose and certain intermediate points.

Harris, who has been operating under the fictitious name of Bay Shore Draying Company, since prior to May 1, 1917, established an operating right by filing tariffs and time schedules showing a seasonal service. Asking that said tariffs and time schedules be canceled, he declares that he has retired from the transportation field and disposed of his hauling equipment.

We are of the opinion that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted therefore.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that W. J. Harris be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue operation of an automotize trucking service between Oakland and San Jose and certain intermediate points, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the tariffs and time schedules heretofore filed by W. J. Harris covering said service be and they are hereby canceled.
