In the Matter of the application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of an industrial spur track 385 feet in length at Asuncion, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of an industrial spur track at Asuncion, in San Luis Obispo County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (Coast Division Drawing 13520) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that the track herein proposed to be abandoned is owned by applicant and is constructed entirely on its right-of-way; that the track was constructed prior to 1914; that said industrial spur track first served the Colony Holding Corporation and was originally used as a wood loading spur track; that the Colony Holding Corporation discontinued the use of said industrial track about ten (10) years ago and since that time said track has been used by your petitioner for the purpose of setting out of outfit cars and is not now needed nor in the opinion of your petitioner likely to be needed for any purpose in the future.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application

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should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove its spur track located at Asuncion in San Luis Obispo County, as shown in yellow on map "Coast Division Drawing No. 13520" attached to the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
