O P I N I O N

This is an application of the Board of Supervisors of Shasta County for authority to construct a public crossing over the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, immediately south of Southern Pacific Company's station of Girvan.

A public hearing in the above entitled proceeding was held before Examiner Satterwhite on May 3, 1929, at Redding, California. It developed at this hearing that agreement was not had between the interested parties as to the exact location of the proposed crossing and upon the suggestion of said parties the hearing was adjourned, it being understood that the County would make a further study of the matter and submit a final plan.

The County not having submitted said final plan and a considerable period of time having elapsed, it appears to the Commission proper to dismiss this application without prejudice, the County having the privilege to file a new application at such time as the location of the crossing is finally determined.

The following form of Order is recommended:

O R D E R

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Shasta having

filed an application with this Commission for authority to construct a public crossing across the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, a public hearing in the matter having been held, the matter being submitted and ready for decision

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled proceeding be, and it is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
