O P I N I O N

In this application Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company asks the Railroad Commission of the State of California for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to construct natural gas transmission lines and appurtenances and to exercise rights and privileges under franchises and permits granted and applied for.

Public hearings were held on this application in San Francisco, California, on October 17, 1929, November 17, 1929, and January 28, 1930.

At the hearing held at San Francisco, California, on January 28, 1930, Mr. Felix T. Smith, attorney for applicant, requested that this application be dismissed for the reason that other and more effective means of securing natural gas had been developed subsequent to such final hearing.

I recommend the following form of order:

O R D E R

Coast Counties Gas and Electric Company having asked the Railroad Commission of the State of California for a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to construct natural gas transmission lines and appurtenances and to exercise rights and privileges under franchises and permits granted and applied for, applicant having subsequently requested that such application be dismissed for the reason set forth in the opinion above, public hearings having been held, the matter being submitted and now ready for decision,

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby orders that this application be and the same is dismissed.

The foregoing Opinion and Order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the Opinion and Order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
