FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the certificates of public convenience and necessity heretofore acquired and obtained by said Joseph Deschamps under Decision No. 10878 and Decision No. 11143, issued in the above entitled proceedings, be and the same are hereby revoked and annulled, and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the tariffs and time schedules heretofore filed with the Railroad Commission covering service between Copperopolis and Milton be and the same are hereby canceled.
