

Decision No. 22337

In the matter of the application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a passenger station building at non-agency station of Malaga in the County of Fresno, State of California.

ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 4th day of April, 1930, asking for authority to abandon and remove the passenger station building located at its non-agency station of Malaga, in the County of Fresno, State of California, and as shown in yellow on the map (San Joaquin Division No. A-3944) attached to the application.

Applicant alleges that one hundred fourteen (114) passengers originated at said non-agency station of Malaga during the year ending November 30, 1929; that the revenue therefrom amounted to Twenty-two (22) Dollars; that the passengers entrained and detrained at said non-agency station have not availed themselves of the use of said building for several years and that in its opinion the passenger station building is no longer necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

It appears to this Commission that this is not a matter in

which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to abandon and remove the passenger station building located at its non-agency station of Malaga, in the County of Fresno, State of California.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
