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

BY THE COMMISSION:

EIGETH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, Decision No. 12580 (23 C.R.C. 841) in the above entitled matter provides, with reference to the steam rates of Pacific Gaz and Electric Company, that such rates be subject to increase or decrease upon approval of this Commission on the basis of three (3) cents per thousand pounds of steam for each ten (10) cent increase or decrease, respectively, per barrel in the price of oil above or below the price in effect on August 1, 1923, and

WHEREAS, Pacific Gas and Electric Company now makes affidavit that on March 11, 1930, the price paid for oil was increased to eighty-seven (87) cents per barrel, which price is six (6) cents per barrel less than the basic price upon which rates were established in Decision No. 12580.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Pacific Gas and Electric

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Company be and it is authorized to increase its present rates for steam, designated as Schodule S-1, for all regular meter readings taken on and after May 1, 1930, so that said rates shall be equal to two (2) cents less than the basic rates established in Decision No. 12580.

IT IS MEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Pacific Gas and Electric Company, if it elects to exercise this privilege, file with the Commission on or before May 1, 1930, a revision of its rates as herein authorized.
