ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of its freight platform located at Arcadia Station on its Duarte Branch, Los Angeles Division, in Los Angeles County, and shown in yellow on a blue-print map (L.A.Div.Drwg. No. B-918) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that the freight platform at this location is an obstruction to the opening of Huntington Drive across its right of way and tracks, as authorized by this Commission's Decision No. 21600, dated September 25, 1929; that said freight platform was constructed in 1907, and has not been used for the receipt or delivery of freight subsequent to 1912, and that in the opinion of applicant, said freight platform is not now needed nor will likely be required in the future for the business of applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be, and it is, hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon and remove its freight platform located at Arcadia Station on the Duarte Branch of its Los Angeles Division, in Los Angeles County, and as shown in yellow on blue-print map (L.A.Div.Drwg. No. B-918) attached to and forming a portion of the application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
