## O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, filed the above entitled application with this Commission on the 9th day of May, 1930, asking for authority to abandon the station building at its non-agency station of Russell on its Western Division in the County of Alameda, State of California, and as shown in yellow color on Blueprint map attached to the application.

Applicant alleges that the building is an obstruction to view of highway traffic approaching the grade crossing lying adjacent thereto; that an engineer of the Commission recently inspected the said grade crossing and recommended, in order to improve the visibility at said crossing, that the said station building shall be removed or abandoned; that the maintenance of a station building at Russell is unnecessary as the said building is seldom used and the revenue derived from passenger traffic thereat does not, in the opinion of Southern Pacific Company,

warrant the expenditure necessary to relocate said building, in view of which applicant seeks permission to abandon said station building and remove same.
