Defore the railroad commission of the state of california.

In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a passenger shelter shed located at the foot of Potter Street in the City of Berkeley, County of Alameda, State of California.

BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of its passenger shelter shed located at the foot of Potter Street, Berkeley, California, on its Western Division in Alameda County, and shown in yellow on a blue print map attached to and forming a portion of the application.

Applicant alleges that this passenger shelter shed was formerly known as the non-agency station of Potter; that local trains were discontinued at this point on June 8, 1913; that said station of Potter was abandoned as a non-agency station during December, 1914, and that the continued maintenance of said passenger shelter shed is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a

corporation, to abandon and remove its passenger shelter shed at the foot of Potter Street, City of Berkeley, California, located on the main line of its Western Division in Alameda County.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
