BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of the Application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for authority to close agency at Brighton, County of Sacramento, State of California.

Application No. 16500.

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its agency at the station of Brighton, on its Sacramento Division, in Sacramento County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that \$418.00 of passenger business was transacted at the agency station of Brighton during the annual period ending December 31, 1929; that \$219.00 less than carload business was transacted at said station during said annual period; that carload freight business in amount of \$3,201.00 was transacted at said station during the same period; that said agency is unremunerative; and that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the agency station is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

County of Sacramento and California Farm Bureau Federation have informed the Commission, by letters of May 19, 1930, and May 2, 1930, respectively that they will not oppose the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter

in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its agency at the station of Brighton, located on its Sacramento Division, in Sacramento County, and to eliminate said agency name from its station records.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
