BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of the application of the Railway Express Agency, Inc., for authority to abandon its agency at Sheridan, County of Placer, State of California.

O R D E R

Railway Express Agency, Inc., a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its agency at Sheridan, in Placer County.

Applicant alleges that its agent at said town of Sheridan has tendered his resignation and investigation developed that no one can be secured to act as express agent and that if the agent is withdrawn express shipments moving into or out of said point would be handled provided they were tendered to or received from the express messenger of applicant upon trains stopping at said point and at the car door.

Interested parties have advised the Commission by letter that they will not oppose the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority

be and it is hereby granted to Railway Express Agency, Inc., a corporation, to abandon its agency at Sheridan, in Placer County, provided, however, that express shipments moving into or out of said town of Sheridan will be handled by applicant's express messenger on trains stopping at said station of Sheridan, and to eliminate said agency name from its station records.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
