ORDER

Railway Express Agency, a corporation, has filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its agency at Seville in Tulare County. It has in the past maintained a joint agency with The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company at this point; that The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company has received authority to close its agency, and that applicant has been unable to secure the service of an outside party to conduct its agency.

California Farm Bureau has informed the Commission that it does not desire to oppose the granting of this application.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Railway Express Agency, a cor-

poration, to abandon agency at Seville in Tulare County and to eliminate said station from its station records as an agency station, provided, however, that coincident with the abandonment of said agency applicant will receive and deliver shipments at the car door of trains stopping at said station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
