In the matter of the application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of approximately 955 feet of an industrial spur track at Bromela, County of San Luis Obispo, State of California.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filed on May 20, 1930, with the Commission an application, and on September 12, 1930, filed an amendment thereto for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of approximately 735 feet of an industrial spur track located at the Station of Bromela on its main line in San Luis Obispo County, and shown in yellow on a blue print map (Coast Division Drawing No. 20507, Revised July 23, 1930) attached to and forming a portion of the amended application.

Applicant alleges that the track herein proposed to be abandoned is owned by applicant and that it was constructed in 1910 to serve a Beet Dump of the Union Sugar Company, and that the said sugar company discontinued the use of said track about five years ago, and said track has not been used since; that said track is not now needed nor in the opinion of the applicant likely to be needed in the future.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application

should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon and remove approximately 735 feet of an industrial spur track located at Bromela Station on its main line in San Luis Obispo County and as more definitely shown in yellow on map (Coast Division Drawing No. 20507, Revised July 23, 1930) attached to the amended application.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
