

ORDER

Christine Rodberg and Levi Brostrom, co-partners operating public utility warehouses at Hilmar, Merced County, under the firm name and style of Hilmar Warehouse Company, having applied to the Railroad Commission for permission to sell and transfer for \$4,600.00 to A. A. Austerland all of their warehouse machinery, equipment, improvements and business in connection with their South Warehouse known as Warehouse No. 2; and it appearing that A. A. Austerland is at present operating a public utility warehouse business in Hilmar under the name of Farmers Warehouse Company, and the Railroad Commission being of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, as herein provided, therefore,

IT IS HEREEY ORDERED that Christine Rodberg and Levi Brostrom be, and they hereby are, authorized to transfer and sell to A. A. Austerland the warehouse properties and business referred to herein.

The authority herein granted is subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) A. A. Austerland, upon acquiring the properties referred to herein, shall operate the same under the Farmers Warehouse Company Marehouse Tariff No. 1, C.R.C. No.1, effective June 1, 1929, together with supplements thereto, all as now on file with the Railroad Commission.
- (2) The authority herein granted is not to be construed as fixing a value for the purpose of hereafter fixing rates or issuing securities or for any other purpose.
- (3) The authority herein granted will become effective ten (10) days after the date hereof.
