In the Matter of Application of Southern Pacific Company and Sunset Railway Company for authority to close agency at Gosford Station, County of Kern, State of California.

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company and Sunset Railway Company have filed with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of their agency at Gosford Station on the Asphalto Branch of Southern Pacific Company in Kern County.

Applicants allege that but \$6.00 passenger business was transacted at Gosford Station during the annual period ending March 31, 1930; that \$75.00 less than carload business was transacted at said station during said annual period; that carload freight business in amount of \$17,876.00 was transacted at said station during the same period and that, in the opinion of applicants, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicants or for the public.

The Commission has communicated with interested shippers and receivers of freight and the California Farm


Bureau and there appears to be no material objection to the abandonment of said agency.


It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be and it is hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company and Sunset Railway Company to abandon the agency at Gosford Station located on the Asphalt Branch of Southern Pacific Company in Kern County and to eliminate said station from its records as an agency station provided, however, that coincident with the abandonment of said agency applicants will continue to operate said station as a non-agency station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
