SEVENTE SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In the seventh supplemental application, in the above entitled matter, Southern California Edison Company (now by change of name Southern California Edison Company Ltd.), asks authority to sell to City of Pasadena certain electrical distributing property not included among the properties transferred under the authority granted in Decision No. 7707, dated June 9, 1920, or subsequent supplemental orders.

It appears that Southern California Edison Company Ltd. owns electrical distribution facilities in the territory commonly known as the "Bonestell" and the "Lombardy" annexations, which have recently been annexed to the City of Pasadena, and that Southern California Edison Company Ltd. has agreed to sell and City of Pasadena has agreed to buy said properties at the historical cost, as of January 3, 1930, of \$10,353.57 plus subsequent additions and betterments.

The Commission has considered this request and is of

the opinion it should be granted, therefore

Company Ltd., be and it is hereby authorized to sell and transfer to the City of Pasadena for the sum of \$10,353.57, plus the cost of subsequent additions and betterments to date of transfer, those certain distribution facilities more particularly described in the bill of sale designated as Exhibit "i" (attached to and made a part of the applicants' seventh supplemental application), and located within the boundaries of the new annexations, commonly known as "Bonestell" and "Lombardy" annexations, provided that the transfer of ownership of said properties shall be consummated on or before January 1st, 1932.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
