In the matter of the application of
the Railway Express Agency, Inc., for
authority to abandon its agency at
Shively, County of Humboldt, State
of California.

O R D E R

Railway Express Agency, Inc., on October 18, 1930,
applied for authority to abandon its agency at Shively on the
main line of Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company in Humboldt
County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that Six Hundred Eighty-one (681.63)
Dollars Sixty-three Cents express business was transacted at
said agency during the year ending September 30, 1930; that at
the time Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company was granted
authority to abandon its agency at Shively in Decision No.
21316, Application No. 15347, a local resident was appointed
as express agent, and said resident agent has now resigned and
that they have been unable to secure another agent.

Applicant further alleges that the removal of said
agency would not involve the elimination of service in its entire-
ty for express shipments moving into or out of that point would
be handled by the express messenger upon trains stopping at that
point and at the car door.

It appears that a public hearing is not necessary
herein and that the application should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Railway Express Agency, Inc.,

is hereby authorized to abandon its agency at Shively on the main line of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company in the County of Humboldt, State of California, provided, however, that express shipments moving into or out of said point will be handled by the express messenger upon all trains stopping at said point and at the car door.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
