ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, has filled with the Commission an application for an order authorizing the abandonment of its non-agency station of Mead on its Los Angeles Division in Los Angeles County.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business nor freight business was transacted at the non-agency station of Mead during the annual period ending July 31, 1930; that applicant proposes to include said Mead Station within the (agency station) Long Beach switching limits; that any freight business at Mead Station can be conveniently handled at the Long Beach station; that the abandonment of said non-agency station will not involve the abandonment of any facilities; that, in the opinion of applicant, the continued maintenance of the non-agency station is not necessary for the business of the applicant or for the public.

It appears to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary, and that the application should be granted, therefore, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission and authority be, and it is hereby, granted to Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, to abandon its non-agency station of Moad, located on the Long Beach Branch of its Los Angeles Division in Los Angeles County, and to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records, and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said non-agency station.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
