Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on December 9, 1930, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Gaspur, located on the Long Beach branch of its Los Angeles Division, in Los Angeles County.

Applicant alleges that no passenger business nor freight business was transacted at said non-agency station during the year ending August 31, 1930; that it proposes to include said Gaspur Station within the (agency station) Long Beach switching limits; that any freight business at Gaspur Station can be conveniently handled at the Long Beach Station; that the abandonment of said nonagency station will not involve the abandonment of any facilities, and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein, and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEPEBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Gaspur, located on

the Long Beach branch of its los Angeles Division, in los Angeles County, State of California, to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records, and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
