In the matter of the application of PACIFIC ELECTRIC RAILWAY COMPANY for authority to abandon and remove freight platform at Signal Hill Station on its Newport Beach Line in the City of Signal Hill.

BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

Pacific Electric Railway Company, a corporation, on October 6, 1930, applied for authority to abandon and remove freight platform located at Signal Hill on the Newport Beach Line of its Southern Division in the City of Long Beach, Los Angeles County, State of California.

Applicant alleges that for the last several years no freight business has been handled at this location and there are no prospects that the same will be required in the future; that said freight platform is in a bad condition and unsightly appearance and that public convenience and necessity no longer require the maintenance of this freight platform.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pacific Electric Railway Company is hereby authorized to abandon and remove its freight platform located at Signal Hill, City of Long Beach on the Nowport Beach Line in Los Angeles County and as more definitely shown in yellow on the map (C.E.H. 12685) attached to the application.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
